

Digital Libraries Department: Graduate Research Assistant (GRA)

About the Program

The UNT Libraries offer full-time graduate students professional experience through their Graduate Services Assistantships and Research Assistantships (<https://www.library.unt.edu/jobs/gla-gra>). These positions provide tuition benefit program hours and are benefits eligible during the fall/spring semester, but summer positions are paid hourly with limited benefits eligibility. Project Overview

This position is part of a grant funded by the Institute of Museum and Library Services (IMLS) to explore the use of bibliographic metadata for building machine models to help identify high-value publications from large web archives. This project combines the fields of library and information science with artificial intelligence and machine learning to explore new ways of building collections.

Position Description

This 20-hour per week position is for a graduate research assistant to assist in a two-year grant funded project to demonstrate the capability and effectiveness of leveraging bibliographic metadata utilizing machine learning tools and techniques to extract and identify high-content value documents from Web Archives as part of an IMLS funded grant project. The student will assist in the creation of custom scripts for parsing and loading textual data into the machine learning workflow and training and configuring machine learning tools in classification tasks required by the project. They will conduct environmental scans related to the project and review project-related reports. Additionally, the student will participate in project meetings and provide general project and office assistance to the principal investigators.

Position Responsibilities

- Review and analysis of collection development documentation
- Assist with data collection and analysis
- Conducting literature reviews
- Maintaining project documentation
- Reviewing and editing written reports

Hours and Location

This position is part-time at 20 hours per week. Students may set their own schedules but are expected to work during standard office hours which are Monday through Friday 9:00 a.m. – 6:00 p.m. Willis Library on the Denton main campus is the work location for this position.

Minimum Qualifications

You must be a full-time graduate student. Candidates for this position should have an interest in digital libraries and collection development, be self-directed and able to work as part of a project team, be comfortable with computer software and hardware, and be capable of quickly learning and applying new technologies. Desirable candidates should also possess the following skills:

- Organizational and time management skills
- Ability to focus and multi-task in a time-sensitive environment
- Strong writing and editing abilities
- Excellent written and oral communication skills
- Statistical analysis skills
- Background in library and information science and research experience is highly desirable

Preferred Qualifications

- Bachelor's degree in photography or related discipline
- Previous cultural heritage imaging experience in a library or museum setting
- Experience with Capture One software a plus

Pay Rate

Pay rate will depend on student's progression in their graduate program.

- Level 1- \$1,322.22/month, \$11,900/9 months
- Level 2- \$1,555.56/month, \$14,000/9 months
- Level 3- \$1,788.89/month, \$16,100/9 months

Additionally, up to 9 hours per semester (Fall/Spring) of tuition support is offered with this position. There is the possibility of summer tuition support as well.
