# Federal Grant-in-Aid Programs to State and **Local** Governments: Grants Funded FY 1978

he number of federal categorical grant-in-aid programs available to state and local governments stood at 492 as of January 1, 1978, according to a tally made by the staff of the ACIR. This represents an increase of 50, or about 11%, over the 442 counted three years earlier (as of January 1,1975) and reported in the ACIR's 1977 study, The Intergovernmental Grant System: An Assessment and Proposed Policies. The 492 are listed in the body of this catalog—an update of the ACIR's 1975 Catalog.<sup>1</sup>

Categorical grants are directed at specific, narrowly defined activities. In addition to these grants, the federal government in FY 1978 provided fiscal assistance to state and local governments through general revenue sharing and five block grants: the Partnership for Health, Law Enforcement Assistance, Comprehensive Employment and Training Act—Title I, Community Development, and Social Services programs. General revenue sharing and the block grants are not included in this catalog.

In comparing categorical grants in **1975** and **1978**, the table opposite shows the breakdown among the four major types of such grants.

Overall, there was a slight increase in the proportion of formula-based grants—from 33.0% to 34.6% of the total number—and a corresponding drop in the proportion of project grants.

From a functional standpoint, the greatest net increases in number of programs due to Congressional action occurred in pollution control and abatement (12), area and regional develop-

ment (9), research and general education aids (8), health (7), and energy (6). The greatest net decrease was in elementary, secondary, and vocational education (8).

Table 1 shows the distribution of grant programs by subfunctional title used in the federal budget. Health programs are not broken down by subfunction, however, because a major reshuffling of subfunctional classes in the three-year period made direct comparison between 1975 and 1978 impossible. Table 1 reflects one other significant change in assignment of subfunctional, classes. The drop of ten programs under "community development" and the increase of 11 under "social services" is largely explained by the shifting of certain community

action and volunteer service programs from the former to the latter group.

The three-year period saw a small drop in the proportion of grant programs requiring non-federal matching. In 1975 these constituted about 62% of all programs, in 1978 they represented about 57%, as shown in Table 2. The reduction was greater for project than for formula-based grants.

The net increase of 24 formula-based grants reflected the addition of 37 programs by Congressional enactment or funding of previously authorized but unfunded programs, and the discontinuance, replacement, or termination of funding of 13 programs that existed in 1975. The 37 added programs tended to include total population as a factor more often in the allocation formulas than was the case with the dropped programs; personal income was included less frequently. They also incorporated measures of program need more frequently. This probably reflects the addition of new environmental, energy, and transportation programs, in which objectives are more measurable than in such functional fields as human services. Thus, the

allocation formulas of the new environmental grant programs contain such factors as number of public water systems and the volume of hazardous waste; the formula of one energy program reflects the number of dwelling units to be weatherized; and several transportation program formulas include miles of public road or miles of rail.

The net increment of 26 project grants resulted from the addition of 64 programs by new Congressional enactments or appropriations for previously unfunded programs, and the dropping of 38 programs that had been operational in 1975. The added programs covered a range of functions, with particular concentrations in the education (16), health (12), environmental (7), transportation (5), and economic development (5) fields.

A shift also occurred in the distribution of categorical grant programs available to certain types of eligible recipients. A slightly larger proportion of the 1978 programs went exclusively to state governments than was the case in 1975. This trend coincides with the increased proportion of total grants that were formula-based.

since these generally are made to state governments rather than to political subdivisions or to public and private nonprofit agencies. The distribution of grants in the two years 1975 and 1978 by type of grant and type of eligible recipient is also shown in Table 2.

By major grant-administering department or agency, the largest increase in number of grants administered (12) was registered by the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA], followed by the Public Health Service (8), the Office of Human Development Services and the Department of Transportation (7 each), and the Department of Commerce and Energy (6 each]. The small net increase in the Office of Education's programs was due to the consolidation of a number of vocational education programs. Some of the other changes within HEW stemmed in part from the organizational reshuffling involving the abolition of the Social and Rehabilitation Service and the creation of the new Health Care Financing Administration. HUD sustained a net loss of two programs. The breakdown by department or agency is shown in Table 3.

#### METHODOLOGY

I he methodology **used** in counting grant-in-aid programs was basically the same as that followed in compiling the first ACIR Catalog for **FY** 1975. For ease of reference the explanation contained in the earlier volume is repeated here with appropriate changes.

ACIR used a slightly modified version of the definition of grants-in-aid used by the Office of Management and Budget (OMB] in its instructions (Circular No. A-11, Revised] to executive agencies for the preparation and submission of budget estimates. Following is OMB's definition.

Such aid is defined as resources provided by the federal government in support of a state or local program of governmental service to the public. This includes:

- a] Direct cash grants to state or local governmental units, to other public bodies established under state or local law, or to their designees (e.g., federal aid for highway construction).
- b] Outlays for grants-in-kind, such as purchases of commodities distributed to state or

local governmental institutions (e.g., school lunch programs].

- c) Payments to nonprofit institutions when:
- 1) the program is coordinated or approved by a state agency (e.g., the Hill-Burton hospital construction program):
- 2) payments are made directly because of provisions of a state plan or other arrangements initiated by a state or local government (e.g., federal aid for higher education]: and
- 3) payments are made with the explicit intent of augmenting public programs {e,g,, community action programs].
- d) Federal payments to Indian tribal governments, when:
  - 1) the legislation authorizing the payment includes such entities within the definition of eligible state or local units; or
  - 2) the tribal government acts as a non-profit agency operating under state or local auspices (as described in (c) above].
- e) Shared revenues and payments in lieu of taxes (e.g., payments from receipts of Oregon and California grant lands).
- f] Payments to regional commissions and organizations that are redistributed at the state or local level or provide public services.
- g) Federal payments to state and local governments for research and development that is an integral part of the state and local government's provision of services to the general public (e.g., research on crime control financed from law enforcement assistance grants or on mental health associated with the provision of mental rehabilitation services. See (k) and (l) below for exclusions related to research and development].
- h) Direct federal loans to state and local governments for purposes similar to those for which grants are made. (Show these amounts as loans and repayable advances.]
- i] Federal administrative expenses associated with these programs.
- j) Grants directly to nonprofit institutions not covered above, individuals, and profit-

making institutions (e.g., payments for Job Corps centers and to trainees).

- k) Payments for research and development not directly related to the provision of services to the general public (e.g., basic research).
- 1) Payments for services rendered (e.g., utility services, tuition payments, research and development for federal purposes conducted under contracts, grants, or agreements by such agencies as the National Institutes of Health, the National Science Foundation, the Energy Research and Development Administration, the National Aeronautics and Space Administration, and the Department of Defense].
- m) Federal grants to cover administrative expenses for regional bodies and other funds not redistributed to the states, or their subordinate jurisdictions (e.g., the administrative expenses of the Appalachian Regional Commission).<sup>2</sup>

The OMB definition is used here with the following exceptions: shared revenues and payments in lieu of taxes, as well as loan programs, have been excluded, and programs of aid to institutions of higher education have been included only if the aid is exclusively to public institutions of higher education or if state or local governments have a role in the grant process.

Programs meeting these criteria were identified by a thorough search of the United States Code, Congressional and Administrative News, 94th Congress, 1st and 2nd Sessions, and 95th Congress, 1st session, and United States Code Annotated, with pocket supplements for use in 1978. Supplementary documents were used to determine if programs were operational, most particularly the Catalog of Federal Domestic Assistance, prepared by the Office of Management and Budget, and The Budget of the United States Government, 1978 and 1979, Appendix.

Since there are no accepted rules for determining when an authorized activity is a separate program, counting the number of grants is not a simple task. A single statute often authorizes a number of separate, albeit related programs. Other statutes combine activities which, because of funding, operation, or administration, are actually separate programs. Some programs are authorized as earmarked activities under an authorization for a broader activity, or several

alternate activities may be listed as permissable under one program. Such program authorities were not disaggregated here for the purpose of counting unless supplementary sources indicated the desirability to do so.

After a preliminary inventory was made using the above procedure, listings were sent to the departments and agencies administering the grants for confirmation or correction. Replies were received from all 22 of the units canvassed. Their responses were checked against statutory references as necessary. Finally, the entire list was checked against the 1978 Catalog of Federal Domestic Assistance, which was distributed in July 1978.

#### DATA INCLUDED

The present ACIR catalog includes the following information for each program:

- 1) budget subfunction classification and title,
- 2) U.S. Code reference.
- 3) grant type [method of distribution),
- 4) formula factors,
- 5) grant recipients,
- 6) maximum federal share.
- 7) administering agency, and
- 8) Catalog of Federal Domestic Assistance number.

The following brief descriptions of these terms may help the reader in using the catalog.

Budget Subfunction—These are the subfunctional categories that appear in The Budget of the United States Government, FY 1979, Table 12.

Grant Type — Formula grants are those where some sort of formula is used to determine each eligible recipient's allotment from a fixed amount of funds. Project grants require competitive applications from aspiring recipients. In some cases, competition for project grant funds is constrained by a formula that may, for instance, determine how much money applicants within each state may receive. These grants are termed formula-project grants. Seventeen of the 170 formula and formula-project grant entries are asterisked to indicate their open-end character. These cost-reimbursement grants do not use formulas as such to allocate a fixed amount of

money, but rather commit the federal government to reimburse recipient cost at a specified rate.

Formula Factors — These are the kinds of data used to calculate a recipient's maximum allotment. Total population, population subgroups, program level, and per capita personal income are separately identified. In addition, per capita income when used to modify some other formula factor is shown. Provisions for minimum or maximum allotments, as well as "hold-harmless" provisions are also indicated.

Federal Share—The numbers listed in this column indicate the maximum percentage of program costs to be paid by federal funds. The number "100" indicates a grant with no matching requirements. This, however, does not mean the federal grant actually covers 100% of the cost of the aided program or activity. It only means the recipient is not required to match any portion of the federal grant. The "cost-shared" (CS) category includes all those grants where some recipient contribution is required, but the exact amount is not specified. In such cases, the match

may be the subject of negotiation, or may be set by the Secretary. Other symbols are used to indicate when a matching ratio is variable for different recipients, changes over time, or is different for different activities or types of recipients.

Agency—This column indicates the responsible administering agency for each grant. Except for the Department of Health, Education, and Welfare, subdepartmental units are not indicated.

CFDA No.—This is the number assigned the program in the 1978 Catalog of Federal Domestic Assistance.

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# what is ACIR?

The Advisory Commission on Intergovernmental Relations (ACIR) was created by the Congress in 1959 to monitor the operation of the American federal system and to recommend improvements. ACIR is a permanent national bipartisan body representing the executive and legislative branches of Federal, state, and local government and the public.

The Commission is composed of 26 members—nine representing the Federal government, 14 representing state and local government, and three representing the public. The President appoints 20—three private citizens and three Federal executive officials directly and four governors, three state legislators, four mayors, and three elected county officials from slates nominated by the National Governors' Conference, the Council of State Governments, the National League of Cities/U.S. Conference of Mayors, and the National Association of Counties. The three Senators are chosen by the President of the Senate and the three Congressmen by the Speaker of the House.

Each Commission member serves a two year term and may be reappointed.

As a continuing body, the Commission approaches its work by addressing itself to specific issues and problems, the resolution of which would produce improved cooperation among the levels of government and more effective functioning of the federal system. In addition to dealing with the all important functional and structural relationships among the various governments, the Commission has also extensively studied critical stresses currently being placed on traditional governmental taxing practices. One of the long range efforts of the Commission has been to seek ways to improve Federal, state, and local governmental taxing practices and policies to achieve equitable allocation of resources, increased efficiency in collection and administration, and reduced compliance burdens upon the taxpayers.

Studies undertaken by the Commission have dealt with subjects as diverse as transportation and as specific as state taxation of out-of-state depositories; as wide ranging as substate regionalism to the more specialized issue of local revenue diversification. In selecting items for the work program, the Commission considers the relative importance and urgency of the problem, its manageability from the point of view of finances and staff available to ACIR and the extent to which the Commission can make a fruitful contribution toward the solution of the problem.

After selecting specific intergovernmental issues for investigation, ACIR follows a multistep procedure that assures review and comment by representatives of all points of view, all affected levels of government, technical experts, and interested groups. The Commission then debates each issue and formulates its policy position. Commission findings and recommendations are published and draft bills and executive orders developed to assist in implementing ACIR policies.
