

A Catalog of Federal Grant-In-Aid Programs to State and Local Governments: Grants Funded FY 1975



PREFACE

Pursuant to its statutory responsibilities authorized in Section 2 of Public Law 86-380. passed during the first session of the 86th Congress and approved by President Eisenhower on September 24, 1959, the Commission singles out particular problems that impede the effectiveness of the federal system for study and recommendation.

The current intergovernmental grant system was identified as such a problem by the Commission in the spring of 1974. The staff was directed to probe four features of this system: categoricals, the range of reform efforts that stop short of consolidation, block grants, and changing state servicing and aid roles.

This catalog displays in shorthand form the main characteristics of the 442 categorical grants to state and local governments studied by the Commission. The data included here is the basis of the Commission's analysis in another volume in this series. Categorical Grants: Their Role and Design.

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INTRODUCTION

This catalog is the product of a detailed Commission staff investigation of federal grant-in-aid programs for which state and local governments were eligible in fiscal year 1975. The main body of the catalog contains only grants which were funded in FY 1975, and excludes block grants and general revenue sharing.

The use of a catalog of this sort is constrained by its scope and conceptual approach. The catalog is not intended to be a "shopping guide." It does not include many types of assistance which ACIR does not classify as grants-in-aid, such as direct loans; loan guarantees; insurance; sale, exchange, or donation of federal property and commodities; loans of facilities or property; technical assistance; loans of personnel; training; dissemination of technical information; and research contracts. It includes only grants which were funded in FY 1975.

This ACIR Catalog, then, is a summary of grants for which state and local governments were eligible at one point in time. It probably will be of more interest to students of intergovernmental grants than to state, local or federal practitioners, since it displays in tabular form the data on which rests the Commission's analysis of the categorical grant sector.² As such, it can serve as a yardstick by which to measure the grant system at earlier and later dates.

ACIR staff was able to identify 442 funded categorical grants in FY 1975. This number is far smaller than numbers often reported elsewhere. Thus, a note on methodology is in order.³ ACIR used a slightly modified version of the definition

of grants-in-aid used by the Office of Management and Budget (OMB) in its instructions (Circular No. A-11, Revised) to executive agencies for the preparation and submission of budget estimates. Following is OMB's definition.⁴

Such aid is defined as resources provided by the federal government in support of a state or local program of governmental service to the public. This includes:

- a) Direct cash grants to state or local governmental units, to other public bodies established under state or local law, or to their designees (e.g., federal aid for highway construction).
- b) Outlays for grants-in-kind, such as purchases of commodities distributed to state or local governmental institutions (e.g., school lunch programs).
- c) Payments to nonprofit institutions when:
 - The program is coordinated or approved by a state agency (e.g., the Hill-Burton hospital construction program);
 - 2) Payments are made directly because of provisions of a state plan or other arrangements initiated by a state or local government (e.g., federal aid for higher education);

- Payments are made with the explicit intent of augmenting public programs (e.g., community action programs);
- d) Federal payments to Indian tribal governments, when:
 - The legislation authorizing the payment includes such entities within the definition of eligible state or local units; or
 - The tribal government acts as a nonprofit agency operating under state or local auspices (as described in (c) above).
- e) Shared revenues and payments in lieu of taxes (e.g., payments from receipts of Oregon and California grant lands).
- f) Payments to regional commissions and organizations that are redistributed at the state or local level or provide public services.
- g) Federal payments to state and local governments for research and development that is an integral part of the state and local government's provision of services to the general public (e.g., research on crime control financed from law enforcement assistance grants or on mental health associated with the provision of mental rehabilitation services. See (k) and (l) below for exclusions related to research and development.)
- h) Direct federal loans to state and local governments for purposes similar to those for which grants are made. (Show these amounts as loans and repayable advances.)
- Federal administrative expenses associated with these programs.
- j) Grants directly to nonprofit institutions not covered above, individuals, and profit-making institutions (e.g., payments for Job Corps centers and to trainees).
- k) Payments for research and development not directly related to the provision of services to the general public (e.g., basic research).

- l) Payments for services rendered (e.g., utility services, tuition payments, research and development for federal purposes conducted under contracts, grants, or agreements by such agencies as the National Institutes of Health, the National Science Foundation, the Energy Research and Development Administration, the National Aeronautics and Space Administration, and the Department of Defense).
- m) Federal grants to cover administrative expenses for regional bodies and other funds not redistributed to the states, or their subordinate jurisdictions (e.g., the administrative expenses of the Appalachian Regional Commission).

The OMB definition is used here with the following exceptions: shared revenues and payments in lieu of taxes, as well as loan programs, have been excluded, and programs of aid to institutions of higher education have been included only if the aid is exclusively to public institutions of higher education or if state or local governments have a role in the grant process.

Programs meeting these criteria were identified by a thorough search of the *United States Code*, 1970 Edition, as updated through Supplement IV.⁵ Supplementary documents were used to determine if programs were operational.

Since there are no accepted rules for determining when an authorized activity is a separate program, counting the number of grants is not a simple task. Statutes sometimes authorize what are clearly separate, albeit related, programs. Other statutes combine activities which, because of funding, operation, or administration, are actually separate programs. Some programs are authorized as earmarked activities under an authorization for a broader activity, or several alternate activities may be listed as permissible under one program. Such program authorities were not disaggregated here for purposes of counting unless supplementary sources indicated the desirability to do so.

To illustrate the difficulty of counting, consider the catalog prepared in 1964 for the Senate Subcommittee on Intergovernmental Relations.⁷ It included 115 program statements. Yet, if subprograms had been counted, the number would have reached 216. For example, there were ten categories of aid under public assistance, 20 subprograms under community and environmental health activities, and nine subprograms under highways. The current ACIR study, on the other hand, disaggregated the highway programs, but counted 11 programs for the Promotion of the Arts and eight programs for the Promotion of the Humanities each as one program.

Unfortunately, several previously published catalogs of federal grants-in-aid have used different definitional criteria and reported different data. Thus, accurately comparing grant characteristics and the number of grants, as reported in different catalogs, is difficult.

The growth in the number of grants in the past decade has made the cataloging task especially difficult. Some earlier catalogs had to deal with fewer than 100 programs. The Joint Committee on Reduction of Nonessential Federal Expenditures printed detailed compendiums of data on federal grants-in-aid to states, payments to individuals, and other forms of federal assistance in 1947, 1952, and 1957.8 A 1958 Report of the House Committee on Government Operations included program statements for 44 programs operable in 1957.9 The catalog prepared for the Senate Subcommittee on Government Operations in 1964 included 115 program statements. However, if subprograms in fields like highways and public health had been counted, the total would have been 234. A 1964 ACIR report included a similar catalog of 60 programs operable in 1962.10 The staff of Representative William Roth prepared a catalog of some 1,271 programs in 1968,11 but did not distinguish between grants-in-aid and other modes of federal aid. Finally, in 1969, the Senate Subcommittee on Intergovernmental Relations prepared another catalog of some 475 programs.12

Although the present ACIR catalog is more restrictive in its criteria for inclusion, it is largely modeled after the 1969 Subcommittee document and includes the following information for each program:

- 1) U.S. Code reference,
- 2) budget function classification,
- 3) grant type (method of distribution),
- 4) formula factors,
- 5) grant recipients,
- 6) maximum federal share,
- 7) purpose, and
- 8) administering agency.

The following brief descriptions of these terms may help the reader in using the catalog.

Budget Function—These are the subfunctional categories used by the Treasury Department in its analysis of the budget.

Grant Type—Formula grants are those where some sort of formula is used to determine each eligible recipient's allotment from a fixed amount of funds. Project grants require competitive applications from aspiring recipients. In some cases, competition for project grant funds is constrained by a formula that may, for instance, determine how much money applicants within each state may receive. These grants are termed formula-project grants. Fourteen of the 146 formula and formulaproject grant entries are asterisked to indicate their open-ended character. These cost-reimbursement grants do not use formulas as such to allocate a fixed amount of money, but rather commit the federal government to reimburse recipient cost at a specified rate.

Formula Factors—These are the kinds of data used to calculate a recipient's maximum allotment. Total population, population subgroups, program level, and per capita personal income are separately identified. In addition, per capita income when used to modify some other formula factor is shown. Provisions for minimum or maximum allotments, as well as "hold-harmless" provisions are also indicated.

Federal Share—The numbers listed in this column indicate the maximum percentage of program costs to be paid by federal funds. The number "100" indicates a grant with no matching requirements. This, however, does not mean the federal grant actually covers 100% of the cost of the aided program or activity. It only means the recipient is not required to match any portion of the federal grant. The "cost-shared" (CS) category includes all those grants where some recipient contribution is required, but the exact amount is not specified. In such cases, the match may be the subject of negotiation, or may be set by the Secretary. Other symbols are used to indicate when a matching ratio is variable for different recipients, changes over time, or is different for different activities or types of recipients.

Purpose—These classifications are the result of an ACIR staff effort to identify the chief purpose of each program.¹³ The primary distinction is between grants whose purpose is to provide revenue support for particular state and local activities, and those whose purpose is to "stimulate" state or local financial commitment beyond that which would likely occur in the absence of federal aid. The stimulation category is further specified according to the specific "process" being aided (operations, research, demonstration projects, and facilities construction). "Capacity-building" grants are those aimed at strengthening recipient management, planning, personnel, and evaluation capacity. "Training" grants are also separately designated. "National programs" are those grants which fund

what are basically national programs in which recipients have an administrative role, but little policy discretion. Finally, "complementary grants" are those whose purpose cannot be considered apart from other grants. Symbols are also used to designate cases where purpose has changed over time or when two or more purposes apply simultaneously to the same grant.

Agency—This column indicates the responsible administering agency for each grant. Except for the Department of Health, Education, and Welfare, sub-departmental units are not indicated.

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what is ACIR?

The Advisory Commission on Intergovernmental Relations (ACIR) was created by the Congress in 1959 to monitor the operation of the American federal system and to recommend improvements. ACIR is a permanent national bipartisan body representing the executive and legislative branches of Federal, state, and local government and the public.

The Commission is composed of 26 members—nine representing the Federal government, 14 representing state and local government, and three representing the public. The President appoints 20—three private citizens and three Federal executive officials directly and four governors, three state legislators, four mayors, and three elected county officials from slates nominated by the National Governors' Conference, the Council of State Governments, the National League of Cities/U.S. Conference of Mayors, and the National Association of Counties. The three Senators are chosen by the President of the Senate and the three Congressmen by the Speaker of the House.

Each Commission member serves a two year term and may be reappointed.

As a continuing body, the Commission approaches its work by addressing itself to specific issues and problems, the resolution of which would produce improved cooperation among the levels of government and more effective functioning of the federal system. In addition to dealing with the all important functional and structural relationships among the various governments, the Commission has also extensively studied critical stresses currently being placed on traditional governmental taxing practices. One of the long range efforts of the Commission has been to seek ways to improve Federal, state, and local governmental taxing practices and policies to achieve equitable allocation of resources, increased efficiency in collection and administration, and reduced compliance burdens upon the taxpayers.

Studies undertaken by the Commission have dealt with subjects as diverse as transportation and as specific as state taxation of out-of-state depositories; as wide ranging as substate regionalism to the more specialized issue of local revenue diversification. In selecting items for the work program, the Commission considers the relative importance and urgency of the problem, its manageability from the point of view of finances and staff available to ACIR and the extent to which the Commission can make a fruitful contribution toward the solution of the problem.

After selecting specific intergovernmental issues for investigation, ACIR follows a multistep procedure that assures review and comment by representatives of all points of view, all affected levels of government, technical experts, and interested groups. The Commission then debates each issue and formulates its policy position. Commission findings and recommendations are published and draft bills and executive orders developed to assist in implementing ACIR policies.
